s seen in Suburban Essex Magazine: "The weather that we've had this winter in New Jersey has been unprecedented and like nothing we've ever seen before. If you feel like it was colder, snowier and longer than ever before you aren't too far off the mark. If you struggled through this winter imagine how your front lawn feels? Obviously it's not out of the ordinary for turf to go dormant and survive the winter with no problem at all but this year's extremes will likely cause a few issues. It won't be uncommon to find snow/ice damage in the form of winter kill or a very common turf disease that occurs in winters like this one called "snow mold."

We at Sponzilli Landscaping would like to offer you a little bit of advice in regards to how to deal with this year's issues. First off, what are we doing? We've adjusted our program to include a little bit more nitrogen early in the year to help turf wake up

from it's longer than normal period of dormancy. As soil temperatures rise we want to help the turf begin growing and green up. Secondly, as part of our organic approach to caring for your property we've increased the amount of active soil improving microorganisms that are applied with our first application. This will help your turf recover easier as well.

What can you do? First off, it's important to be patient. Your turf may not look it's best during the early part of the spring and it may take a little bit longer to come out of dormancy. If areas appear to be matted down you should lightly rake them to promote oxygen circulation but do NOT get carried away with mechanical dethatching as this could cause permanent injury to your susceptible turf. If you do have any winterkill please feel free to spot seed with a perennial rye grass blend but be prepared for your new grass to struggle when temperatures heat up. It will also be likely that any damaged areas may fill in with crabgrass because there is nothing to compete with it.

We promise to do our best and anything in our control to help your lawn look it's best this spring.


AVA High Line Building – Up on the GREEN ROOF in Chelsea

The soon-to-be-green rooftop landscape is the masterwork of New York City's new leader in urban landscape design, Sponzilli. The plan called for 6,700 square feet of BIOtrays by Green Roof Solutions. These trays are made of coconut husk fiber and are filled with mineral soil and planted with three varieties of sedum. Eventually, the BIOtrays break down and create a monolithic system as their decaying components will gradually nourish the mineral soil by providing additional organic matter. But the result will be lush, green vegetation and a beautiful, peaceful setting in the heart of Chelsea.

The Sponzilli Landscape Group is one of the leaders in New York City's rush to go green. They are
